In Year 2, children will be taught a 'Read, Write Inc' spelling programme to help them learn spelling rules and patterns. Each week we will focus on a new spelling rule and complete activities to help children practise and apply this rule to spell words correctly.

Some children are not quite ready for spelling rules and patterns so they will continue their daily phonics sessions.

Year 2: Autumn 1 2024

English

In English we will continue to teach reading and writing through 'Talk for Reading' and 'Talk for writing' strategies.

We will begin our English learning by focusing on the features of a journey tale. We will read a model text called 'The Papaya That Spoke' and children will become familiar with the structure of a journey tale. They will then be supported to innovate the text and re-write it with their changes. Alongside this we will read our High Quality Text, 'Zeraffa Giraffa' which will help children learn writing tools such as using carefully chosen adjectives and similes. Finally, children will independently write their own journey tale to show how much they have learned. In the second half of the term we will move on to learning about and writing recounts.

Grammar/punctuation sessions will take place daily within our English lessons. We will recap skills taught previously such as capital letters and full stops and also be learning how to use other types of punctuation such as speech marks and apostrophes for contracted words like 'won't'. The children will also learn about exclamatory sentences and using exclamation marks.

In addition to spelling/phonics and English we will have daily handwriting sessions to help children develop confidence in writing using a cursive style.



Maths

For the first half of the term children will focus on Place value and recap previous mathematical concepts from Year 1. We will be completing assessments to assess any gaps in knowledge and these gaps will then be addressed within maths starters.

By the end of this half term children will be able to recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number and this will enable them to solve a range of mathematical problems. Children will be confident in comparing and ordering numbers from 0 up to 100 using the $<$, $>$ and $=$ signs.

Times tables will be taught in maths sessions and regularly in mental arithmetic. By the end of Year 2 children should be able to recall their 2, 5 and 10 times tables and recognise the related division facts.

Each day children will have an arithmetic session to help them develop speed with the four key skills of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. On Fridays children will have an arithmetic test to give them the chance to practise and apply independent problem solving. Afterwards we go through the answers together. Any misconceptions are addressed straight away and any further practise that is needed is incorporated into future lessons.
