

We would like children to select at least one of the homework challenges below for this term, however children can do as many as they wish. This will run alongside the regular reading, maths and English homework that are set.

PSHE - Being Me	Science - Living things and their	Geography - Spatial Sense
Draw a picture of yourself doing some of the things you are responsible for at home. E.g. keeping your bedroom tidy, looking after your toys.	Environment Create an information booklet about one of the habitats we have learned about (desert, underground or rainforest). Think about which animals and plants live there and how they are they adapted to survive in their habitat. Make a list of things in your home/garden that are alive, dead or have never been alive.	Create a map showing your favourite park in your local area. Don't forget to include a key! Plan and go on a walk around your local area. Take photos to show your route.
Computing- Information Technology all around us	RE- What did Jesus teach us? (Being Kind)	Visual Arts - Colour, Shape and Texture
Create a poster showing the information technology that you and your family use at home.	Create a story map to retell a parable that Jesus told. E.g. The Good Samaritan.	Create a colour wheel showing the primary and secondary colours.
Write a set of esafety rules that could be shared with all children in the school. What rules do we have for keeping safe online?		Create a colourful picture using only geometric shapes (the shapes we can name). Think carefully about the composition of your shapes before you start.
