PE - CHANGE OF DAY - Friday

PE kit to please be worn to school on a Friday. Children need to wear PE kit as per the school prospectus; making sure to have a jacket and joggers in case PE is outside. You must ensure that earrings are not worn and long hair is tied back for children's safety. Thank you.

Water bottles and snack

Homework and reading books

Children have 'Homework Challenges' that they can complete during the half term. You will receive information about this separately.

English

This half term we will continue to rehearse our oral story telling skills through our new story 'The three little pigs' by Pie Corbett.

Children will have the opportunity to write, draw and discuss the events, characters and settings.

We will continue to have daily phonics sessions.

Within these sessions the children will have the opportunity to practise and rehearse reading words using the sounds previously taught.



Maths

We will continue to focus on numbers individually.

Looking in depth at how the numbers are made, how they
can be shown as numbers and objects as well as how to
carefully count them.

Children will have lots of opportunity to explore number through independent investigation as well as in guided groups with an adult.

We will be focusing on the topic of Christmas and thinking about the question; What is Christmas? This will involve exploring Christianity.

Children will have the opportunity to listen to stories, join in with discussions and complete activities based around the weekly topics.
